**SESSION 1**

- A. **Gifts of the Holy Spirit in my life**- How many gifts of the Holy Spirit are there? What are they? How do you get them/use them in your life? What's the big deal about these gifts? [Could work in Fruit of the Holy Spirit as well?]
- B. **Women in the Bible**- It may seem like Eve gave all women in the Bible a bad name, but that's not true! There are several important female leaders in the Scriptures, women who heard God's Word and lived it with their lives. Who are these great heroines of the Sacred Scriptures? What did they do? How can they help your spiritual life in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century?
- C. **Millennial Saints**- The call to holiness is for everyone, but it seems like the Saints were always older and "grown-up". The Church recognizes several saints who were either children or adolescents when they died. What *recent* Saints/Blessed's does the Church recognize and what virtues of theirs can I imitate in my life?
- D. **Eucharistic Miracles**- At various times throughout the history of the Church, God has granted certain miraculous events to take place in order to show His goodness to the world. What exactly is a Eucharistic Miracle? How does the Church determine one? What is the role of science in determining such a miracle?

**SESSION 2**

- A. **How to Pray the Rosary**- What is the Rosary? How did it develop? Isn't praying the Rosary a form of worshipping Mary and making her equal to God?
- B. **Lectio Divina (Bible)**- How do I read the Bible? How can I understand God's word and live it in my life? Is there a "right" or "wrong" way to read the Bible?
- C. **Stations of the Cross**-A traditional Lenten devotion, the Stations of the Cross are images and meditations that help us reflect on Jesus' last hours on Earth, from his sentencing by Pontius Pilate, to his being taken off the Cross and laid in a tomb. They help us reflect on what the Savior did for us on that Good Friday, and lead us to a place of gratitude and thanksgiving.
- D. Church Architecture**- How we build our Church buildings can influence the way we pray. How does the architecture of our Parish Churches of St. Francis and St. Clare direct our mind to God? Why are Church buildings built in certain ways?

**SESSION 3 \*\*Required for All Students\*\***

**My Faith life after Confirmation-** Guest Speaker. TJ Genzale, a junior at Regis College will share about his faith life after his Confirmation June 1, 2019. TJ has been a Catholic school student since Pre-K, spending 10 years at St. John the Baptist School in Peabody before attending Bishop Fenwick High School where he graduated in 2021. TJ enrolled at Regis College as a major in the honors nursing program, and a minor in Laboratory Studies and anticipates graduation in Spring of 2025. He will talk about his faith journey first as a student in Catholic schools and then as a Confirmed Catholic who has had an encounter with Jesus and is eager to evangelize those around him.
